

# TkcBackup User Guide

When you first start tkcBackup, you'll see this screen:



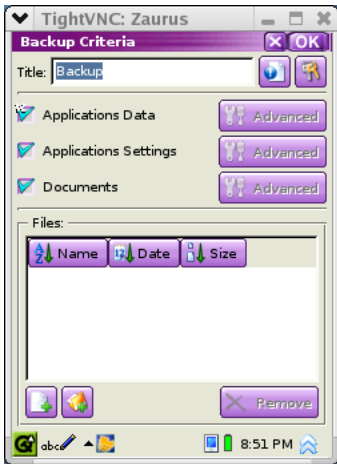
## To Create a Backup:





1. You can choose where you want your backup file to go. Tap the arrow to the right of the box that says Compact Flash. A menu drops down with 4 options on it: Compact Flash, SD Card, Home Dir and Documents. If you want to save to somewhere else, tap on the folder icon to the right of the down arrow. Select the directory you want to save the backup file to. Now when you tap the down arrow to select your destination, the directory you chose will be in the drop-down list. I chose /mnt/card/Documents:



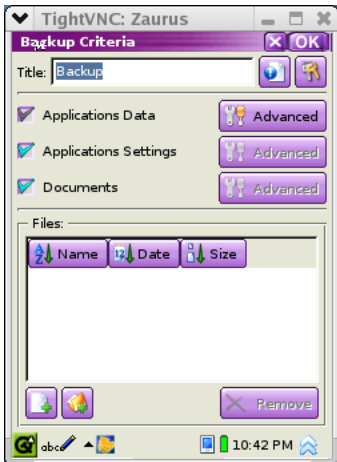
After you select your destination, tap OK.

2. Tap “New” button and the “Backup Criteria” screen comes up:

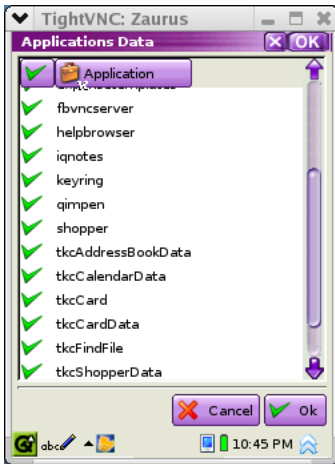


3. Pick a title for your backup file or you can leave it as “Backup”. To the right of the title box are two icons,  and . Tap the  icon to add a comment to the backup. Tap the  to set a password to password protect the backup file.

4. Select the files you want to back up. If you tap the box to the left of Application Data twice, the checkmark changes color and the Advanced tab will become available:





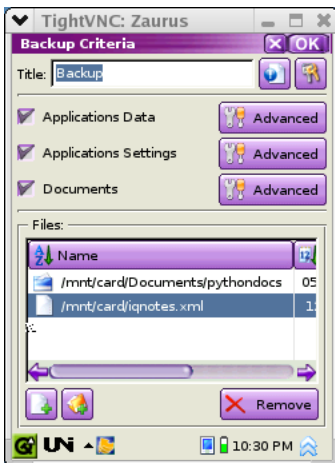
5. Tap the Advanced button to select which application data you want to back up. All application data in RAM is selected by default:



6. Tap the box to the left of Application Settings twice. Tap the Advance button to choose the Application data to back up. All application data in RAM is selected by default.

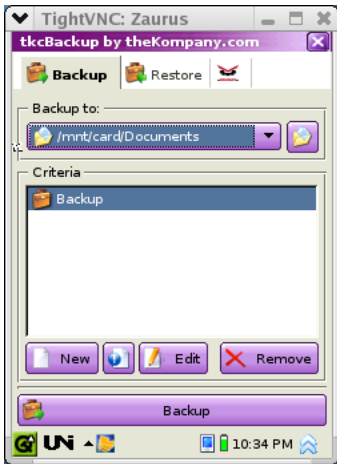
7. Tap the box to the left of Documents. Tap the Advance button to choose the Documents you want to back up. All documents in RAM are selected by default.

8. If you have other data you want to back up, such as data on an SD or CF card, you can add the files to your backup criteria by tapping the  (Add files) or  (Add folders). Use the Add Files icon to add individual files. Use the Add Folders icon to add an entire folder to the backup criteria. I added one file and one folder to my backup criteria:



9. Once you've selected all the data you want to back up, tap OK.

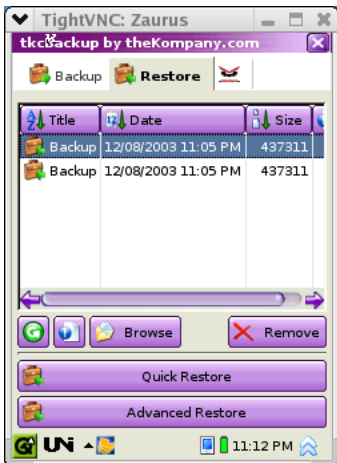
10. To run the backup, select the backup you want to run from the list in the Criteria window:





11. Tap the Backup button on the bottom of the screen. When backup is complete you'll get a message saying "Backup Successful".

### To Restore Backup:

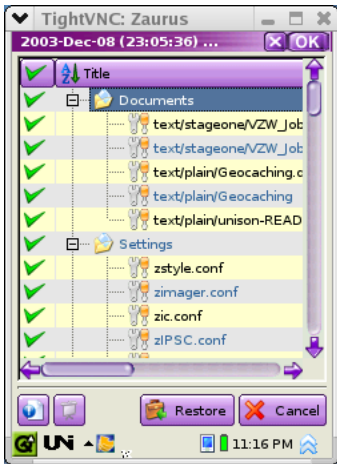
1. Tap the Restore tab.
2. Tap the Browse button. Browse to where your backup file is located.
3. If you want to restore your entire backup, select the Backup you want to restore from, then tap the Quick Restore button:



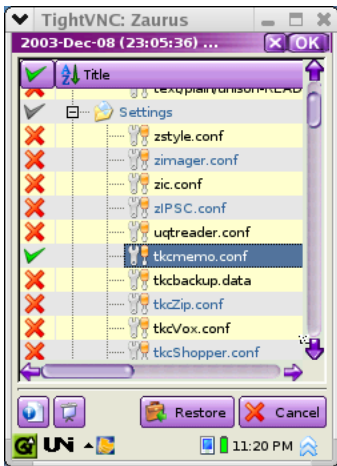
 Tap to reload screen (this will remove the double entries in the list after adding a backup to the Restore list).

 Tap to view the backup comments


- If you want to restore just one file or several files but not the entire backup, tap the Advanced Restore button. This will bring up a list of all the files in the backup. All files are checked by default:




- De-select any files you don't want to restore by tapping on the checkmark to the left of the file. If you tap to the left of the directory, it will uncheck all the files in that dir (an "X" appears in front of them, then you can select the one(s) you want to restore):



- Once you've selected the files you want to restore, tap the Restore button. When the restore is finished, you will get a message "Restore Successful" or an error if it wasn't successful.

**Warning:** Deleting a backup file from the list on the Restore Backup screen will delete the backup permanently from your Zaurus.
